Or view them through glass bottoms boats with **Blue Heron Cruises** or **Bruce Anchor Cruises** on your way to **Flowerpot Island**. Launch your own SUP adventure with rented gear from **Thorncrest Outfitters** or join **Fathom Paddle Guiding** to view the historic Big Tub Lighthouse and shipwrecks at your own speed.

Tobermory is a fun, bright and flavourful marine community with art galleries, scrumptious treats and nautical antiques. Watch the magic happen at **The Sweet Shop**: where fine confections are created the old fashioned way. The area boasts of amazing hiking, safe shallow beaches and natural attractions, all perfect to host your next retreat.



Do

 Come see Saturn's rings, Jupiter's moons and the Great Red Spot with **Bayside Astronomy** every Friday and Saturday evening at dusk in the summertime at the Peninsula Observation Deck, just steps from the Lion's Head Marina. At **Greig's Caves**, explore natural limestone caves and breathtaking views from 300 feet above the sparkling waters of Georgian Bay. Or head to **The Bruce Trail**, to hike in a nature reserve known for the largest concentration of glacial potholes on the escarpment.


Shop

 To find that uniquely Canadian-made reminder of your restful unwinding in Lion's Head, visit **The Dandy Lion**. Discover hidden secrets at **Hellyer's Food Market**. An unexpected staircase in the cereal aisle transports shoppers to **Grandad's Attic**, to pick up a board game or elusive antique for the cottage.

Eat

 Before heading out to enjoy the serenity of Lion's Head, grab a perky cup of fair trade organic coffee from **Rachel's Bakery and Café**. Lunch is served at **Marydale's Family Restaurant**, a cozy neighbourhood hangout in the centre of town. Many scrumptious choices on menus illustrated by local school children, but locals will say the Crispy Chicken Wrap is their hands down favourite. Walk, drive, ski or snowmobile to the traditional English pub, **The Lion's Head Inn**, at the end of the day to savour their panko breaded Perch Feast.

 Trip Advisor's top rated B&B on the Bruce Peninsula, **Taylor-Made Bed and Breakfast** welcomes you home to a relaxing evening and gets your day fueled with energetic choices for breakfast. Warton Basecamp to the Bruce Peninsula

As the provisioning headquarters to the beautiful Bruce Peninsula, Warton is the perfect basecamp for any day hike, boat trip or camping adventure.

Pack your bags, explore the wilderness of the region, and challenge yourself to the top of the escarpment.

Nestled between the rugged limestone cliffs of the Niagara Escarpment and the shores of Georgian Bay, you can't help but notice the stunning landscape and opportunities to touch, climb and experience the outdoors right at your fingertips.



Do

With magnificent views of Colpoy's Bay, **Bluewater Park** offers a waterfront campground, picnic and playground areas, swimming pool, splash pad, tennis courts, fitness trail, historic Train Station, ball diamond and Warton Willie. On Groundhog Day, this nationally-renowned prognosticator makes his annual spring prediction at the **Warton Willie Festival**. For a breathtaking hike, take the **Bruce Trail** north from the park to climb the red spiral staircase to Spirit Rock Lookout and the **Spirit Rock Conservation Area**.

Shop

Food, fashions, and furnishings can be found on the main street in Warton. Pick up some delicious Warton Willie Droppings or Bruce Trail Mix from **Northern Confections** and start your shopping experience at **Josie's of Warton** for a fantastic dress fitting session. Before heading to the cottage, stop at **Home by Design** to pick up contemporary home decor for a chic element, or **Rankin River Trading Company** if rustic cottage is more your style.

Eat

You'd be crazy to miss the Gourmet Local Lamb Burger with garlicky homemade Caesar Salad at **Green Door Café**, or for a vegetarian option, try the Roasted Vegetable Pita with Goat Cheese. For outdoor dining, grab an incredible Bento Box Combo from **The Warton Inn** for a picnic in beautiful Bluewater Park or dine on the waterfront patio of **Dockside Willies**.

Stay

Glamping is taken to a new level at **The Spirit Rock Outpost & Lodge**. In addition to conventional motel accommodations, four Cabin Tents are burrowed into the bush and provide all the comforts of traditional lodgings. Located in a Heritage-designated home, **The Wright House Bed and Breakfast** is an Edwardian mansion with antique furniture, cozy rooms and delectable home-cooked breakfast.

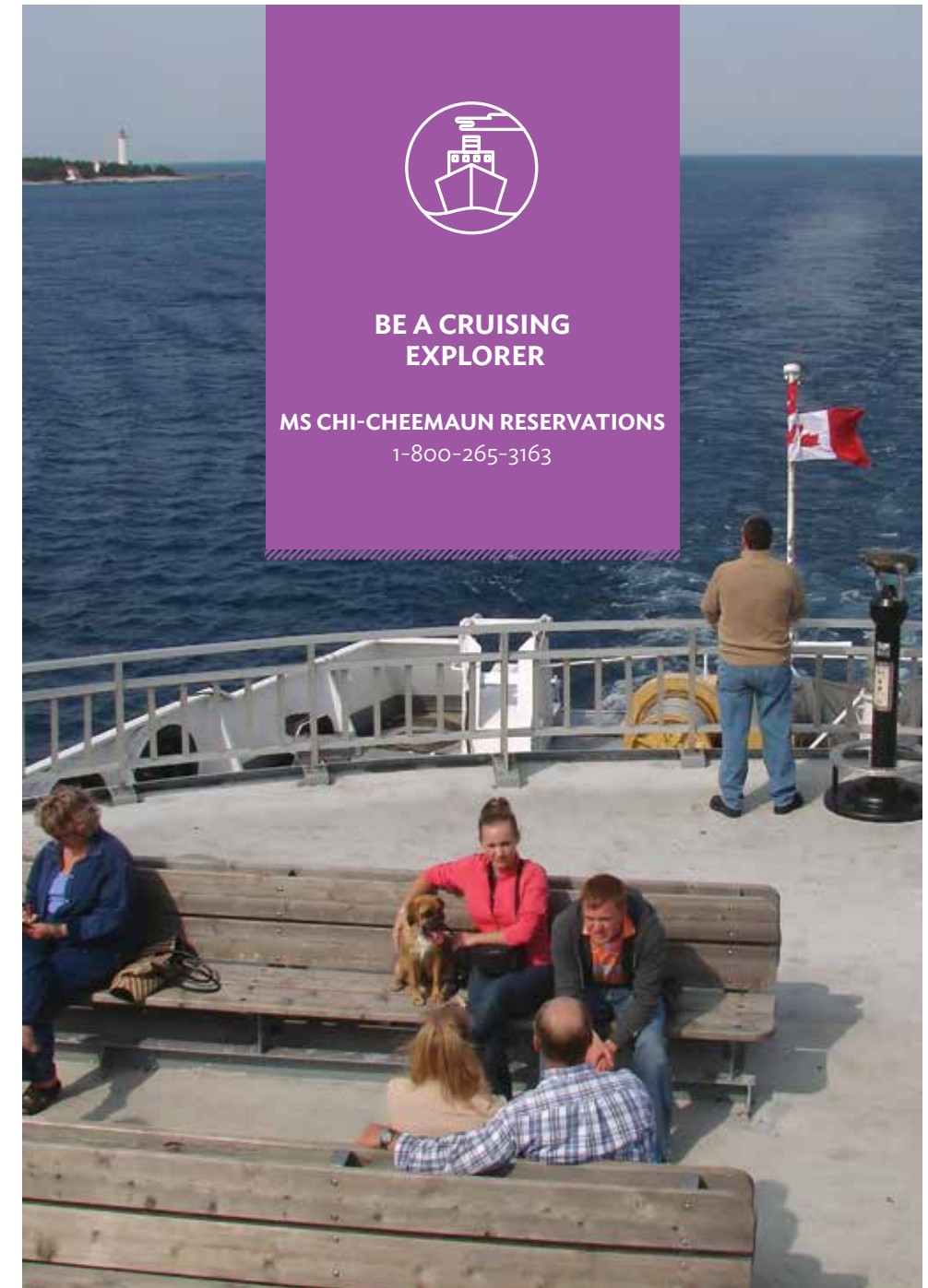
Coming home, gaze west from the MS and watch the sun melt into golden Lake Huron.

Board the MS Chi-Cheemaun, or the Big Canoe, by car, camper, or bike (motor and pedal) or bus for a short cut to Northern Ontario or an experience in its own right. Set sail for a 2 hour cruise from Tobermory at the very tip of the Bruce Peninsula, to Manitoulin Island, the world's largest freshwater island. The 111 metre ship can ferry almost 650 passengers and over 140 vehicles! To make the 40 kilometre crossing comfortable, the ferry has a complete cafeteria service, a children's play area, indoor and outdoor lounges and a "Boatique" gift shop.

But the MS Chi-Cheemaun isn't only a means of getting from here to there. **Sunset Dinner Cruise & Concert Series** pair Traditional Storytelling and live concerts with delectable three-course, gourmet dinners.

Are you catching the last sail back to the mainland? Late evening sailings are a mystical star-gazing voyage. An experienced astronomer guides passengers through the Bruce Peninsula's Dark Sky Reserve. Night sky **Astronomy Tours** will help you find stars, meteors and many other hidden treasures in the sky.

Fathom Five National Marine Park is an underground museum.

Renowned for scuba diving, Fathom Five National Marine Park is Canada's first underwater park and boasts 22 known shipwrecks! Regardless of your experience as a diver or snorkeler, the dive shops of Tobermory will introduce you to Canada's premiere dive destination.

The park is over 116 square kilometres of crystal clear water surrounded by an archipelago of 19 islands. Sheer cliffs and huge caves can be found both on the islands and beneath the turquoise waters. And for the diving enthusiast, the remains for over 20 historical shipwrecks lie 10 to 150 feet beneath the surface waiting to be investigated. Savage storms have left masts broken and scattered, but massive timbers remain intact, giving divers and snorkelers a glimpse of steamers and cargo ships that brought passengers and supplies to the Bruce Peninsula over a century ago.

Tobermory is one of the few places in Canada to have a hyperbaric dive chamber, refurbished in 2015 to provide essential medical and educational support for the North American diving community.

Dive shops, sightseeing and charter vessels and the Parks Canada Diver Registration Centre are all located within walking distance in Little Tub Harbour. All divers planning to dive in Fathom Five, need to first obtain their dive tag by registering at the Centre.

Located at tip of the Bruce Peninsula, Flowerpot Island is a scuba diver's paradise, an explorer's dream and a family's memorable vacation.

Flowerpot Island is located in **Fathom Five National Marine Park**, 6.5 km off the shore of Tobermory and is only accessible by boat. **Blue Heron Cruises** and **Bruce Anchor Cruises** are the only two private boat tour companies that make multiple trips daily beginning in the spring until mid-fall. Both companies feature glass bottom boat tours that explore some of the

shipwrecks laying just beneath the surface in Big Tub Harbour and share the history of those shipwrecks as you embark on the journey to Flowerpot Island.

Flowerpot Island gets its name from the two natural "flowerpot" rock pillars. Here you can explore the flowerpots, caves, historic light station and ancient cedars, some over 750 years old! To scope out all of the beauty on the island, it is recommended to plan for 5 hours. And remember to wear running shoes or hiking footwear; rugged terrain ahead for the adventurous.

If you're interested in spending the night, there are 6 campsites on Flowerpot Island that can be booked through Bruce Peninsula National Park Reservations.

the road: Mondays at **Miller's
Family Camp**, Wednesdays
at **Summer House Park** and
Thursdays at **Singing Sands** in
Bruce Peninsula National Park.

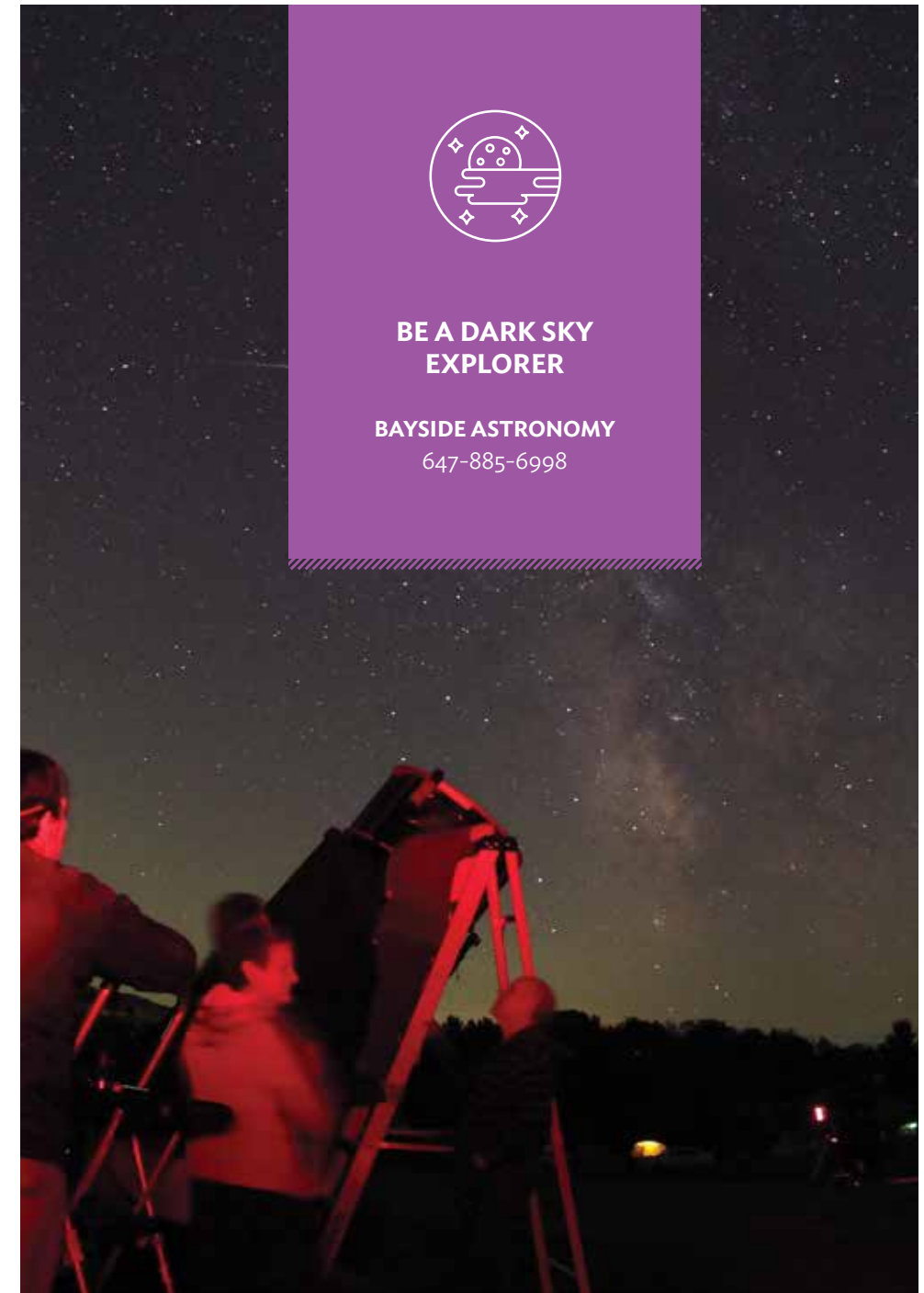

Climbing boulders, or bouldering, is a self-powered, low impact outdoor activity that is both fun and challenging.

"Problems" are the paths climbers take to get to the top and each boulder may have many problems of varying difficulty. Since ropes and harnesses are not used, bouldering is made safest through the use of spotters and protective crash pads.

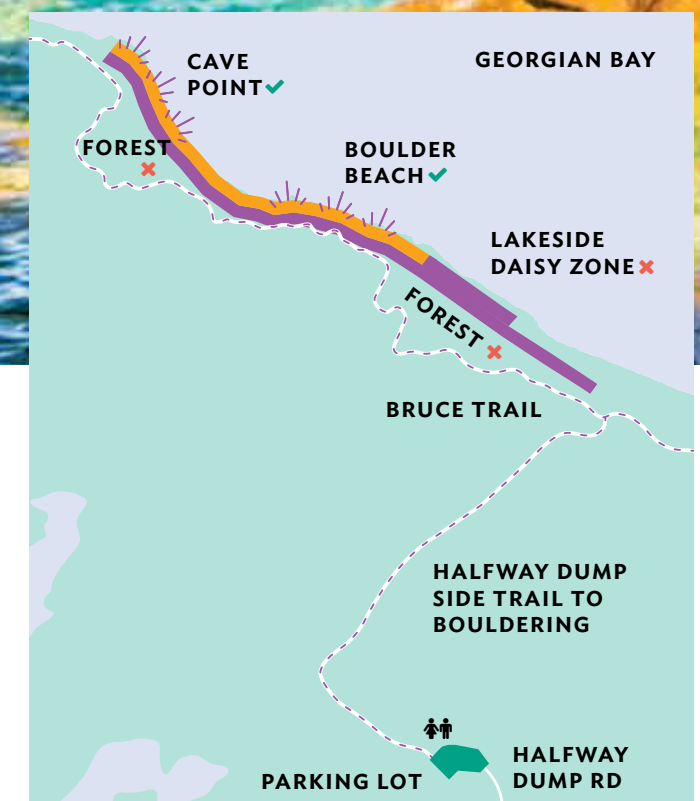
As a core part of UNESCO's Niagara Escarpment World Biosphere Reserve, Bruce Peninsula National Park sprawls over 156 square kilometres and is home to many endangered and at risk species. Bouldering is only permitted from Cave Point to Boulder Beach at Halfway Log Dump within Bruce Peninsula National Park. An agreement between

Parks Canada and the Ontario Access Coalition provides bouldering guidelines to protect the park and keep you safe. Visit www.ontarioaccesscoalition.com for more information and to review their Interpretive Bouldering Guide to Halfway Log Dump.

It's not uncommon for the parking lot to fill to capacity in July and August, so the best

time to boulder is in the spring and fall when the crowds have dwindled. There is a nominal cost to park at Halfway Log Dump and keep in mind, beyond the parking lot, there are no washrooms or garbage receptacles. Get up-to-date information on parking, visitor attractions and alternate bouldering and climbing destinations at the Parks Canada Visitor Centre in Tobermory.

Browse the **Southampton Art Gallery** at the historic **Southampton Town Hall**. See the vintage cars on **Cruiser's Nights** at the flag each Thursday evening in the summer.

Stay

Chantry Breezes Bed and Breakfast is a gracious Victorian home with spacious wrap-around porches, patios, and flower gardens and offers the discerning visitor an exceptional standard of accommodation. 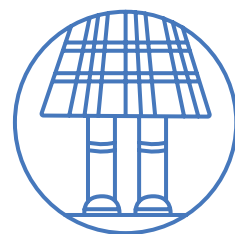

Kincardine Scottish Pipe Band Parade

As eight o'clock approaches, there's an energy that starts to build as spectators await the march of the Scottish band.

Listen to the faint drone of the bagpipes as the band begins to warm up in Victoria Park.

The sound of lawn chairs being set up as faithful attendees claim their spot along the parade route. The excitable laughter as youngsters stand impatiently in line for ice cream while the anticipation grows. A main street tradition in Kincardine since 1948, you'll thrill to the sights and sounds of Scotland as the Kincardine Scottish Pipe Band parades Queen Street every Saturday evening in the summertime.

The band forms up at **Victoria Park** (Durham Market Square North), with hundreds – if not thousands of spectators falling in line directly behind, awaiting the procession. At 8pm sharp, rain or shine (and we really mean rain or shine), we march!

Follow the Band as they parade north on Queen Street to Quinn Plaza (just south of Broadway Street), where the Band will take a short, and well deserved break before embarking on the return route. Be sure to stay with the Band all the way back to Victoria Park, and enjoy a short concert following.

Understandably, not everyone is able to visit on a Saturday in the summertime. If visiting any other evening during July & August, you're invited to Walker's Lookout to enjoy the haunting sounds of the **Phantom Piper**, as the sun is piped to sleep from atop the Kincardine Lighthouse. The lament of the pipes can be heard as the sun starts its descent, until well below the horizon. This unique experience is an ode to the **Legend of Donald Sinclair**, which can be found inscribed on a plaque on Walker's Lookout.

With its warm shallow waters, generous open space and steady crosswinds off Lake Huron, it's a kiteboarder's paradise! Whether a beginner surfer or seasoned rider, Sauble Beach Kite Surfing School offers lessons from May until October to get your feet wet. They are fully equipped with all of your equipment needs.

Surfing

Any surfer will tell you, timing is everything, and nowhere is that more evident than the surf on the Great Lakes. With more than 17,000 kilometres of coastline, Kincardine is a spot with the perfect combination of underwater terrain and wind currents to create those clean peeling waves. But swells here are fickle; they can come up fast and sometimes they will be gone in as little as three hours. Other times a swell can last all day, giving surfers unlimited action.

Kincardine has been recognized as Ontario's surfing hot spot! The wind from Lake Huron and the depth of the water makes the perfect waves for great lakes surfing! During the spring and the fall, you can get as many as 50 days of solid surfing.

Kincardine has also made it's way in the surfing circuit. Each fall, West Shore Lakeside Surf Shoppe hosts The Great Lake Surf Competition. Surfers compete from all over and the event continues to grow each year! No gear? No problem; West Shore has all your gear and rental needs for the perfect Great Lakes surfing experience.

Kayaking in the Fishing Islands

With the warm sun overhead and a shore lunch packed away, set out for a paddle through crystal clear waters around the spectacular dolomite islands off the west coast of the Bruce Peninsula.

Spy on cormorants and bald eagles, hover over the shipwrecked ruins of the Gold Hunter and absorb the breathtaking scenery that unfolds in front of you.

This Fishing Islands, an archipelago of over 70 islands 3 kilometres off the western shore of Oliphant through Howdenvale, is designed for the first time kayaker to discover the sport of sea kayaking. The area's warm shallow channels are protected from the oftentimes harsh conditions of Lake Huron's open waters. Some islands are large, almost spanning 100 acres, while others are no larger than the exposed top of a shoal, so pay attention when you are paddling.

Whether you are starting in Oliphant and travelling north to Howdenvale, or paddling the route in reverse, the fresh air, the lush green of the islands along the way and the joy of adventure guarantees pure rejuvenation.

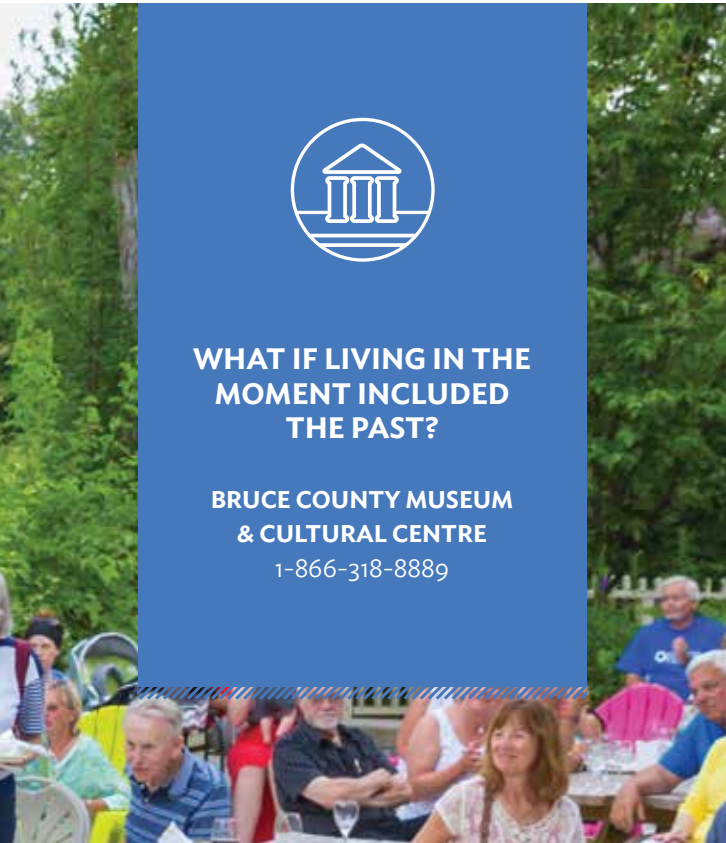

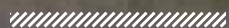

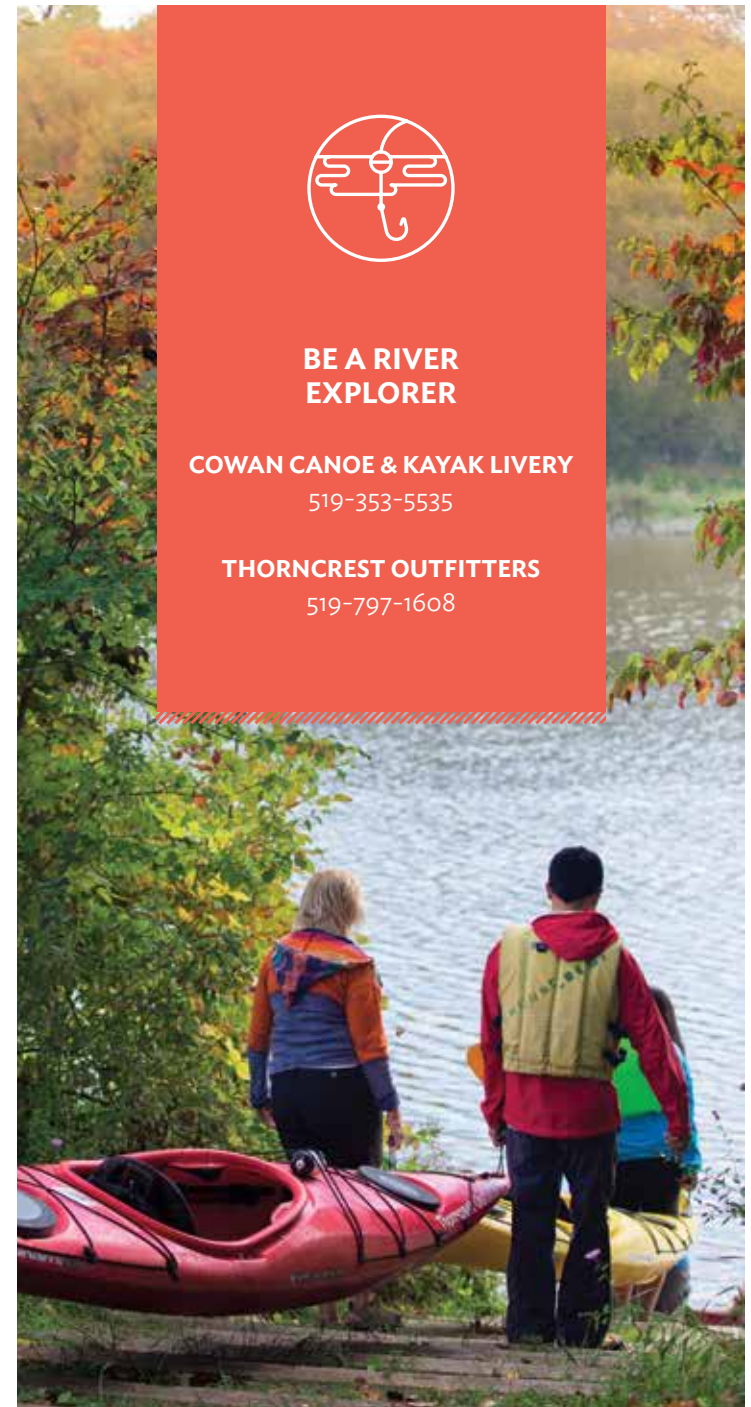
The Saugeen River is home to the one of the largest runs of migratory Rainbow Trout/Steelhead in the province of Ontario. It's safe to say that Bruce County boasts some of the best steelhead fishing anywhere in Southern Ontario, if not the Great Lakes. The characteristics and biology of the Saugeen River teamed with Ontario Steelheaders efforts has created this crown jewel of Ontario fishing. Through an intensive local stocking program and ideal river conditions that encourage wild born fish, the annual run of trout is estimated to be over 30,000 fish. Pack some dry clothes, a good pair of waders and your favourite trout gear and head out to get "hooked".

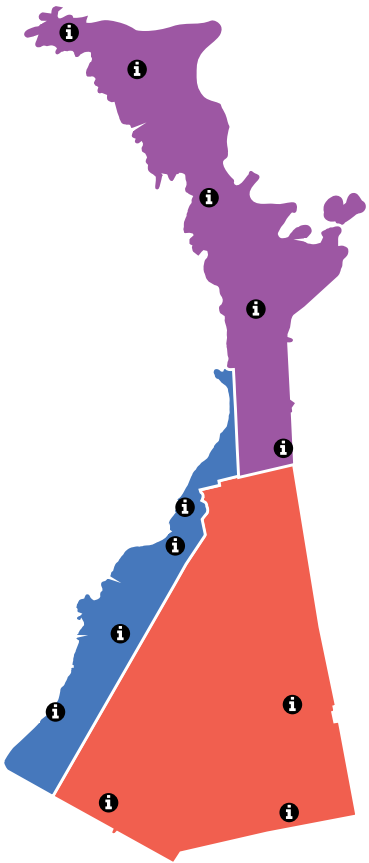
